3. Principal Report

1. Traffic Flow: connected with Trustee Stefano Pascucci and he has reached out to the Councilor for Ward 3 to discuss the possibility of the road behind Tomken Twin Arenas as a thruway and she will reach out to the various departments in the City of Missisauga and conservation authorities to discuss if this could be possible.

The area behind the arena is a floodplain and that it may not be usable.

Ms. Campese has engaged the operations department of the board and they are aware across all schools the traffic concerns are growing at an alarming rate and that in their assessments human behaviour is at the root of the concerns brought forward. The department will come asses Pocock again but the layout of the drive thru is the best solution based on past assessment over the years.

Ms. Campese submitted a request to the City for a traffic assessment.

A request was put forward for parking enforcement and they have been deployed. Tomken arena management have firmly stated they will not reopen the drive thru of their parking lot. They emphasized that their "decision is not motivated by a desire to create barriers between our groups, but in a commitment to the safety of our team and patrons."



The boards Plants Project Officer of Landscaping and Grounds will be doing a site visit to discuss best solutions for painted walkways and new signs have been ordered and will be installed in the next few weeks.

2. Catholic Education Week is also Mental Health Awareness Week.

- 3. School uniform and BLACK PANTS. All schools will be moving to a dark coloured pant as it is more inclusive of all students and their needs. Effective 2025-2026 students entering grade 9 will only have the option of purchasing a black pant with the school logo from McCarthy's Uniform provider. All other students may switch to black pants but it's optional. The new pant will be grandfathered in. The school will look at a new option/colours of a sweater and is working with McCarthys for possible options and have a student survey.
- 4. Graduation events have been sent to all students, posted on the school website also. Dates for the Grad mass, Prom and Grad ceremony has all been posted. Cashonline is open for the collection of grad and prom fees should students wish to attend.
- 5. Afterschool math session will be open to all grade 9 and 10 students beginning in May until June. Information went to the community today.
- 6. Get Ready program for Grade 9 incoming students will be on Tuesday, August 27 and Wednesday, August 28. Information will go out to feeder schools non-DP students in the next few weeks. All DP students will automatically be registered.
- 7. Pocock will undergo a regular financial internal audit. This is a routine audit that cycles through all schools and it will be for the time frame prior to my arrival.
- 8. The request for new Bleachers has gone out to tender. Once bids go in a vendor will be selected and the board will proceed with the PO. The hope is that installation occurs late summer and start of the new school year.
