- 4. Principal Report -
- Semi-formal was a success and student feedback about the venue was positive.
- Lenten drive has collected approximately \$2000. Efforts are being made to encourage the community to bring soap, food, and personal care products to the school, or contribute via cashonline.
- SGF presentation school generated funds
- Ms. Campese provided the council with a copy of the SGF Annual Plan for the current school year.
- The SG plan was submitted to the board via the prior acting principal Ms. Burazin.
- Ms. Campese is currently reviewing the annual plan and some minor adjustments will be made to ensure appropriate allocations of funds based on her observations of current school needs.
- SGF Annual Plan Summary 2023-2024 School Year:
 - September 1, 2023 opening balance \$229023.73
 - Anticipated in-year revenues \$110653.00
 - Anticipated in-year expenses \$129500.
 - Projected in-year Deficit \$18847.00
 - Projected closing balance \$210176.73
- Ms. Campese will continue to observe school needs, speak with students for input, and allocate as necessary for student needs
- Categories Ms. Campese reviewed included:
 - Charities
 - Student activity fees
 - Transcript fees in future the board will manage.
 - Presidents' choice and YMCA breakfast funding
 - Revenue and fundraising and other categories projected at approximately \$92000
 - To get a yearbook you need to pay
- NEW in 2024-2025 Activity fees will be \$45. The activity fees will not include the cost of the yearbook.
- The yearbook in 2024-2025 will be a separate purchase for any student who wishes to have one. The cost is yet to be determined. The school is working with the vendor at this time and information will be communicated to students in the new year.
- Former acting principal allocated based on projected funds. Ms. Campese has reviewed the funds and revised allocations as shown in the Annual SGF plan to council members today.
- SGF will continue to support non interactive projectors.
- Ms. Campese is working with the board to help support the renewal project of new flooring in the library.
- SGF will continue to support student events.



- Ms. Campese reviewed all money collected from students in the 2023-2024 school year for various events, teams, clubs pays for the events, team and clubs expenses.
- Ms. Campese explained that when expenses exceed money collected for example, the Semi formal, the is supported by the school.
- A school need identified by Ms. Campese are bleachers in the gymnasium. They will cost approximately \$75,000 which is a SGF priority for the school. This includes the \$20,000 tear down cost of the existing bleachers.
- A renewal project from SGF will include painting the school gym. It will be a minimal cost due to the board already initiating a renewal project to paint the ceiling pipes. Murals will be painted out and a plan for future murals will be considered.
- Question regarding the graduation photo from 1989 was posed. Ms. Campese explained that she was informed some photos were damaged and that they are working on a plan how to manage the number of photos that need to be put back on the walls while complying with fire safety code.
- There has been a date set for the Public Budget Information Meeting. however, April 24 was proposed as the next council meeting with the hopes it aligns with the Public Budget Information Meeting. Ms. Campese informed council that there will be light dinner prior to the meeting starting which will commence earlier to accommodate the budget meeting which she will live stream for members who are in person.
- There will also be a link to the community to watch from home.

Parent Engagement Night:

- Ms. Campese advised the committee that \$500 is provided for parent engagement activities. The family of schools would like to come together to have an evening for all schools. The following ideas were discussed as possible topics for a guest speaker and evening for parents/families:
- Internet safety
- Drugs and vaping
- Youth gambling risks
- Mental health and wellness

- Goal of the parent engagement is to educate parents

Council Chair addressed the questions from the February council Meeting presented to trustee Stefano Pascucci regarding walkway traffic flow. Catherine spoke with the trustee: collab with the city for easement in the back; better flow of the traffic; - she requested follow up. Ms. Campese suggested she would contact Stefano and remind him of her past concerns and a follow-up would occur by him and she would share at the next council meeting any updates.

Question by council chair: Website; the board will take it upon themselves to revamp the shell – can we make the website user friendly? bring it to family board level? Catherine stated the Trustee said he would bring it up and it was not brought up. Principal reminded the chair that school websites are created by the board and if changes were to occur that would be communicated to the schools. Ms. Campese has not received any communication about any changes.

Question by the chair: Literacy classes – need a minimum number of students to attend Mr. Brady informed that the there were teachers willing to teach it but not enough students who expressed interest for it to run in semester 1 and meet board guidelines for registration. They will try it again in semester 2.

Question is Sr students can offer other literacy help/workshop tutoring help? Yes, Senior students are tutoring. Students can volunteer and earn hours. Support for students for literacy prep also occurs in English class. Literacy and numeracy scores exceed Ministry averages School scored at 89 success rate.
